I am so excited about the accomplishments of CHSA Development! At heart, CHSA Development is a partner to CHSA, Inc. CHSA funds housing opportunities, and CHSA Development works to build those houses, to bring

homes into being. And the work completed by CHSA Development in the past ten years has given me a feel for what more could be done.

I first came to CHSA as the president of the West Savannah Community Organization in 2019. I was honored to inherit the vision of the late Ronald Williams, prior president of WSCO. He could see a new street, new homes and even a new gym. With the help of partners like CHSA Development, we were able to bring his vision to life. Cumming Street had 21 properties in need of renovations or replacement. Today, there is a new feel to the street – the blight is gone and the neighbors have homes that match their modest means.

CHSA Development does not just partner with the City of Savannah, although they have borne the costs for many investments such as Savannah Gardens. Recently, CHSA Development has also partnered with the Galvan Foundation and the Georgia Port Authority. We aspire to help businesses connect their best interests with the best interests of the neighborhoods of our region. This expands opportunities for everyone.

We are building new partnerships with young contractors and builders. We are building new partnerships with port-side communities such as Garden City and Port Wentworth. The expansion of our work opens more doors for people to catch that vision and work together to fulfil the vision.

Every time I think we are maxed out on our vision for what is possible, a new vision opens up!



The Old Fashioned Way to Earn a Person's Trust

When I first became a City employee, I found that some people didn't trust me.

At the time, I didn't blame them. Many of the people I encountered had been taken advantage of over the course of their lives. The reasons they didn't trust were centered in experience. It wasn't a secret.

So I had to tread carefully. I would be invited to step into the yard first, and just ask for the opportunity to talk to the owner as a person. I knew I was making

progress when I was invited to step up onto the porch. And then, I would share maybe some information about a program or assistance that they might need. And to share how needed renovations could help them stay in their homes.

Finally, I might get invited inside, or even to meet their trusted relatives. And I would reward their trust with accountability. I myself personally would walk their paperwork for home repair or other programs directly to the City department, make the needed copies and return the originals to the owner. That was how I built trust.

Well, CHSA has also built trust with people. This is the secret of 35 years of success. It starts with treating people like people—listening and asking questions. And being careful with confidences. And opening up opportunities that invite neighbors to dream of their own futures. Even a future as a first- time home owner. Because they focus on building trust, CHSA staff help people to see a new vision of what is possible for them and for our city.

CHSA's mission, the nuts and bolts, is to create and fund housing opportunities for persons with modest incomes. But the nitty gritty, the real core of that, is to help people catch a vision of what might be possible for them!

This is why I serve on the board of CHSA, because they have earned my trust to bring vision and opportunities to people.
