CHSA Development increases the number of safe, quality, affordable homes through the following strategies:


- Builds affordable housing units for families earning modest incomes.

DID YOU KNOW?


Over half of Savannah residents are Black, but Black applicants file only 24% of mortgage applications.

Overall mortgage applications have declined by 53% in the Savannah MSA since 2021. Unfortunately, the percentage of Black households applying for a mortgage remains starkly lower compared to White households. In addition, the percentage of Black household mortgage applications denied has increased, from 21% in 2021 to 28% in 2023. Applications withdrawn by the applicant of both races were 15% in 2021, but in 2023, 18% of black applicants withdrew from the process. **CHSA** is committed to racial equity in lending.

Affordable housing construction is not as easy as Willie Dasher makes it look. The low-key, genial contractor runs his construction site with a gentle demeanor that belies his relentless focus on quality. Willie Dasher knows exactly what details matter - and his workers know that he will notice if it isn't done right. This is why his company has received contracts from CHSA Development for two decades .

Dasher is one of many minority-owned housing developers and contractors working with CHSA Development. Through one of CHSA's innovative loan programs, Mr. Dasher has been able to access small business capital at a low interest rate. All of the contracts offered by CHSA Development in 2022 were to minority-owned businesses. CHSA loans are provided to construction businesses developing affordable housing only and are subject to some restrictions.

Dasher has constructed hundreds of homes in Savannah. Asked for his favorite part of his job, Dasher doesn't hesitate. "I love the final walk-through with the new owner," he says. "To enjoy <u>their</u> joy at imagining this house as their own is something I never get tired of."

Dasher's family are all involved in contracting and housing development. Stephenie Dasher points to CHSA executive director Anita Smith-Dixon as a mentor. "When I hit a roadblock, she helps me think through the problem solving process to find my own answers," says Mrs. Dasher.


